# GROWER OF THE YEAR FIELD DAY GUEST SPEAKERS

#### Scott Balsillie, Eastern Australia Agriculture

Scott Balsillie oversees Eastern Australia Agriculture's myBMP-certified operations at Clyde in Dirranbandi and Kia Ora in St George. Clyde produces up to 2,000 hectares of irrigated cotton, while Kia Ora grows up to 4,500 hectares. A bankless irrigation system has improved water efficiency, profitability, machinery and labour use, and fertiliser application. Strategic environmental flows to the Narran wetlands also support native bird breeding.

#### **Catherine Marriott OAM**

Catherine Marriott OAM is an agribusiness professional and advisor, chairing the Grains Sustainability Framework Steering Group and serving on the Farm Trade Australia Board. She recently completed a 2024 Nuffield Scholarship on the impact of global ESG policies on Australian farmers and will share her findings.

#### **Bec Fing: House Paddock Training and Consulting**

Dirranbandi's Bec Fing, founder of House Paddock Training and Consulting, has provided training and consulting since 2005. Her team helps regional businesses with planning, WHS, and HR management, delivering practical solutions to improve operations.

#### **Brooke Summers: Cotton to Market, Cotton Australia**

Brooke Summers leads Cotton Australia's Cotton to Market program, which supports demand for Australian cotton. The program helps brands and retailers integrate Australian cotton into their supply chains and promotes the quality, sustainability, and benefits of Australian Cotton.

Andrew Sevil developed systems to improve on-farm efficiency, starting with building a 53-metre tower to boost internet connectivity. His technologies are used on farms across the region.
